COMMUNITY GUIDELINES

We hope you enjoy living on campus. Several important policies are detailed below. A more comprehensive list of community guidelines may be viewed on our website at sfasu.edu/reslife.

ALCOHOL

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted in residence halls. Students must obey state law regarding alcohol use, including laws prohibiting public intoxication and providing alcohol to minors.

If alcohol or other substance abuse is suspected or alcohol poisoning or intoxication requiring assistance of university or emergency personnel occurs, students are subject to referral to the Office of Student Rights and Responsibilities for evaluation.

CONSOLIDATION

Consolidation is a process through which the SFA Residence Life Department allocates the maximum amount

of space to residents in the residence halls. The process affects residents who live alone in a double-occupancy room because a roommate does not arrive or moves out of the room during the first three weeks of the academic semester. If we are unable to assign another person to fill the open space, it becomes necessary for residents who do not have roommates to consolidate (move in together). Students who wish to pay the private room fee may avoid the consolidation process.

DAMAGES

Students are responsible for completing an inventory sheet at check-in documenting existing damages in their unit. Students will be charged for damage to their unit and/or furnishings that were not present and/or noted during move-in. Residence Life does not condone the use of Command strips or other adhesives that may remove paint.

DESK HOURS

Desk hours vary in each residence hall. Contact a staff member for specific hours.

DRUGS

Any unlawful manufacture, possession or delivery of any controlled substance, illegal drug or drug paraphernalia is strictly prohibited and may lead to suspension from the university.

ELECTRICAL POWER STRIPS/ EXTENSION CORDS

If additional electrical outlets are needed, students must use electrical power strips with surge protectors approved by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratory. Multiple plug adapters, splitters and extension cords are not permitted.

MAINTENANCE/WORK REQUEST

Students may request maintenance or report potential safety hazards through the Residence Life website or through the representative at your hall's front desk.

MEAL PLANS

All students who live on campus (except residents of Lumberjack Village, Building 3) are required to purchase one of SFA's Dining Services residential meal plans. For more information on Dining

AMENITIES

ICE MACHINE

An ice machine is located in most facilities for students' convenience. Ice is not provided to fill portable coolers.



INTERNET

Each room is equipped with high-speed Ethernet network

connections, as well as wireless internet services.

LAUNDRY FACILITIES



Coinless laundry machines are available in residence halls. Students should use high-efficiency laundry detergent. The university is

not responsible for lost, damaged or stolen laundry. Mechanical problems with the machines should be detailed on the work request link at sfasu.edu/reslife or reported to the front desk.

TELEVISION

A color TV is available in the lobby or TV lounge of most facilities. Residents

PERSONAL PROPERTY/ INSURANCE/PERSONAL LIABILITY

As an on-campus resident, your belongings are not protected by the university from theft, vandalism, fire, sprinkler system activation, maintenance failure or for any other reason. Maintenance failure does not constitute a reason for a refund. The Residence Life Department strongly encourages students to either (1) make arrangements with their parent's or guardian's homeowner's insurance company to insure personal belongings, or (2) purchase separate personal property insurance or renter's insurance policy.

In some cases, parent's homeowner's insurance will cover damage to personal property in a state-owned residence hall, but this is not always the case. Items of value should be marked for identification and serial numbers recorded. The University Police Department has engraving tools available for students to use. The university does not provide theft or damage insurance for residents; therefore, each occupant is encouraged to purchase some type of personal property insurance.

Students should secure medical insurance coverage for themselves, as well.

QUIET HOURS

In keeping with the academic goals of students residing on campus, quiet hours are required from 10 p.m. to 10 a.m. in each facility. Courtesy hours are always observed. Some facilities enforce 24-hour quiet hours a day to enhance the academic environment.

ROOMMATE/SUITEMATE RIGHTS

The roommate/suitemate's rights must be given high priority with regard to respect and visitation. The roommate should neither be compelled to leave the unit in order to accommodate a guest nor be placed in situations that might cause embarrassment or inconvenience. Roommates/suitemates are encouraged to resolve problems between themselves before involving a staff member.

SMOKING

SFA is a smoke-free campus. The use of tobacco and vape products are prohibited on campus.

STAFF MEMBERS

The community assistant is a student staff member who lives in the building with the residents. CAs are mentors for residents and available as a resource in the facility. For more information about student employment opportunities in the Residence Life Department, please visit our website.

VISITATION

Residence hall visitation is a privilege. Guests must enter through the main lobby, where they will be met and escorted by the resident.

Visitation times:

- First-year and single-gender facilities (Hall 10, Hall 14, Kerr Hall, Lumberjack Landing and Steen Hall):
 - ◆ 10 a.m. to midnight (Sunday through Thursday) and 10 a.m. to 2 a.m. (Friday and Saturday).
- Non-first-year coed and hybrid facilities (Griffith Hall, Hall 16, Hall 20, Lumberjack Lodge, Lumberjack Village and Wisely Hall):
 - ◆ 24-hour visitation with the consent of the roommate.

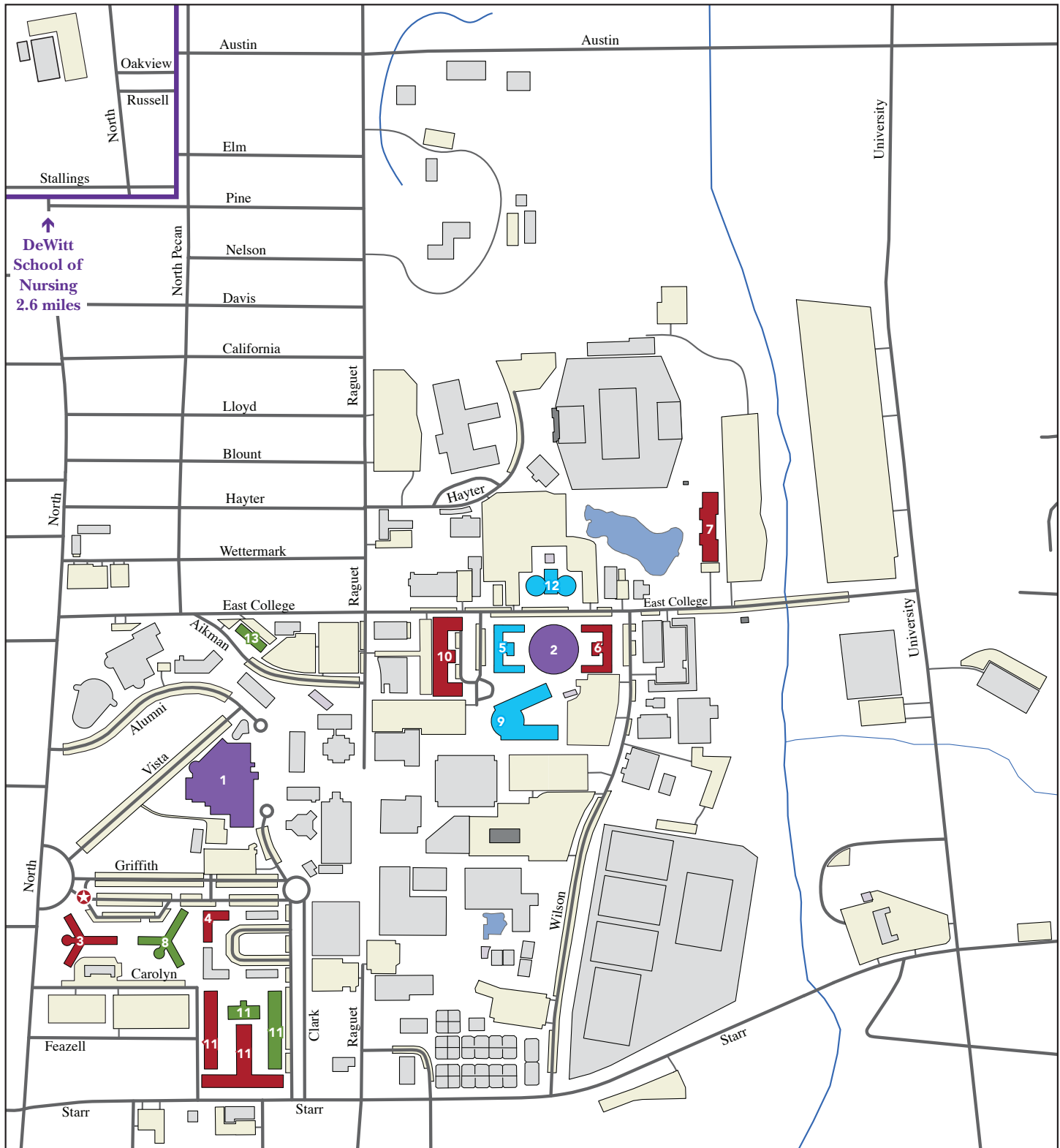
